



OKLAHOMA COUNTIES AND COUNTY SEATS

At the time of statehood, the boundaries of seventy-five counties were defined along with their county seats by the Constitutional Convention. County boundaries and county seats could be changed if people so desired. Harmon and Cotton Counties were formed after statehood. Eight counties have changed their county seats.

The largest county is Osage with a total area of 2,293 square miles; the smallest is Marshall with an area of 360 Square miles. Osage County was formerly the Osage Reservation, the only reservation to remain intact as a single county. Cimarron County, the most western county, is the only county in the United States bordering three states — Colorado, Texas and New Mexico.
